Clutter Checklist for Condominium Corporations

(a) How cluttered is the unit (Refer to Clutter Rating Scale)

Low	Items normally used in one week are not put away (some cloths on floor, dishes in sink etc.). No real fire safety concerns.
Mild	Items are covering all tables, beds, and counters; still able to walk easily through unit, piles up to 1 foot deep.
Moderate	Items piled up to 2.5 ft. with only passageways through rooms. Fire safety concerns. Fire alarm and/or smoke detectors may be disarmed.
Severe	Items piled overhead, egresses blocked, minimal access to facilities, fire and smoke detectors disarmed, windows blocked.




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Clutter Image Rating: Living Room
